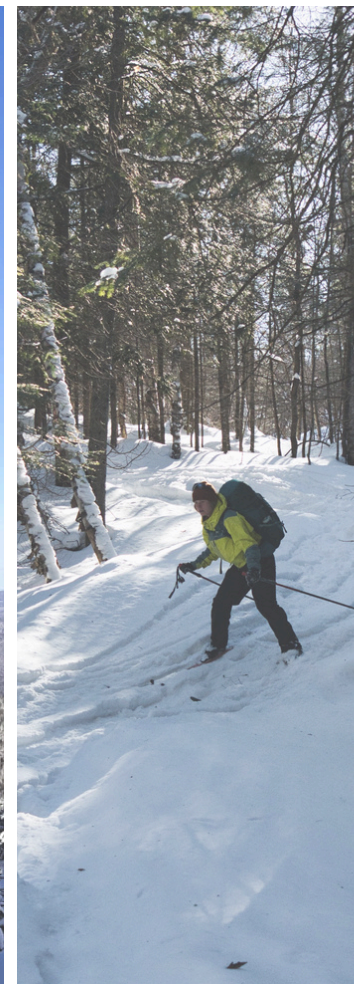

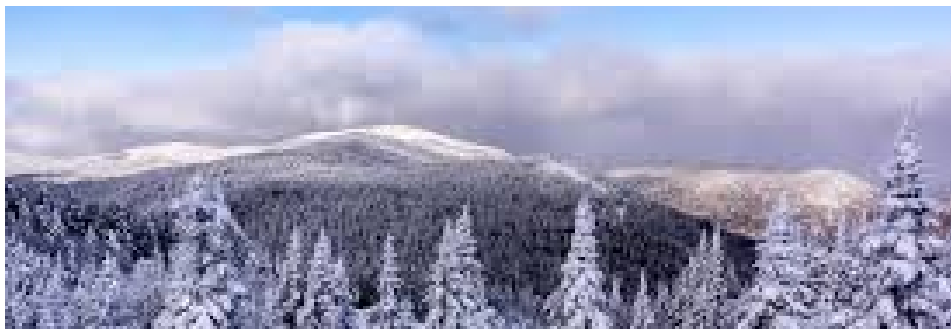
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The day before departure

Meet your guide and other adventure skiers at Farouche Tremblant the evening before departure. Make yourself at home in your unique accommodation, then meet your guide who will brief you on the skiing to come.

FAROUCHE Tremblant

On the North Slope of Mont Tremblant, far from the crowds, enjoy an immersive, secluded experience that allows you to reconnect with nature. Combining adventure and comfort, your private cabin provides allows you to soak in the Northern landscape. Regale yourself with all that Farouche has to offer: hot-tub, relaxation areas and gourmet meals made with local produce. A communal dining room allows you to share special moments with your travelling companions in a cosy atmosphere by the wood-burning stove.



Day 1: From North to South

After a lavish breakfast at Farouche, a shuttle takes you to the trail start in Mont Tremblant Park. You'll ski 19 km with 692 m of elevation, passing by a frozen waterfall, descending through a maple grove to the mountain's north side. After a warm break, continue along the North-South trail to Tremblant village, where a well-deserved après-ski awaits you. Then, return by shuttle to Farouche for a gourmet dinner.

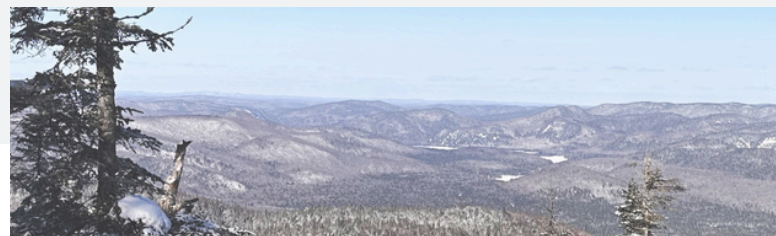

Day 2: Mont-Tremblant Traverse

After a hearty breakfast, take a shuttle to Mont-Tremblant's south side. The ski touring up track leads you at the start of the famous Johannsen trail. You'll soon be climbing in the ancient forests of Mont-Tremblant National Park. Once at the summit Pic Johannsen, enjoy spectacular panoramic views of Laurentians. The day ends with a gloriously long descent of the opposite side of the mountain. Take a 5 minute shuttle to Farouche, where your adventure ends.
